In addition to the support of the Bryan community, Katie is thankful for the support of her parents. They have always encouraged her to pursue her dreams, and they even come to Bryan every First Friday to help set up and work at their daughter's booth.

Much of the artwork Katie creates is influenced by her background in English. She often takes inspiration from "nostalgic children's literature" such as Frog and Toad, Win*nie The Pooh*, and the world of Beatrix Potter. Katie graduates from Texas A&M University in May, but she plans to remain in the College Station area and continue to build her business and work as a reporter, content writer, or copy-editor. She hopes to eventually expand Katie's Kreations into its own store and illustrate her own children's books.

Down


A small tear




