



Glasscock Graduate Research Fellowship

Required Signatures for Application

The Glasscock Center for Humanities Research annually funds up to ten Graduate Research Fellowships at \$3,000 each. If a fellowship is awarded, the funds will be transferred to the student's home department.

To be eligible, students in affiliated departments have to be working on a doctoral dissertation or master's thesis but can be at any stage of their projects. Students are expected to work closely with their advisors on a project description, rationale for the grant, and budget. The budget might include conference participation and travel, fieldwork or archival work, or it might be for research materials. It may not be used for stipends or tuition. The outcome should be a dissertation or a thesis, or a significant portion thereof.

Glasscock Center Graduate Fellows will make up the community of scholars who populate the Glasscock Colloquium Series and use the experience as a tool to improve their own writing and projects and help each other to improve the quality of their work.

Students must have both the Director of Graduate Studies' and the Department Chair's approval to be nominated. Students may receive the Glasscock Graduate Research Fellowship more than once, but must wait two years before reapplying.
