Research Interests:

Late 19th and early 20th century U.S. history: impact of war on society, culture, and the environment (and vice-versa), with a primary focus on the American Civil War, World War I, and World War II. My dissertation research will center on creating a critical, comparative analysis of Civil War prisons by examining a variety of factors (environment, role of camp commandants, personal relations, et al) that impacted rates of survival throughout camps on both sides of the conflict. My secondary interest lies in the intertwining of immigration, nativism, and xenophobia in the 19th century.
