# Program options

- Students can enter with or without a Master's degree
  - The 96-credit hour program is designed for students who enter with a Bachelor's degree or a Master's degree in some other field besides sociology
  - The 64-credit hour program is for graduate students
     who enter with a recent Master's degree in sociology

- 7. Transcripts
- 8. Three letters of recommendations
- 9. Official GRE scores (optional)
- 10. Official TOEFL scores (international students only)
