



## International Studies Honors Program

The International Studies (INTS) Honors program will provide advanced work and expanded opportunities for academic research experience and superior scholarly achievement for distinguished students. In recognition of superior achievement, students who complete the Honors Program will receive the INTS Honors designation on their official transcript.

### Admissions to International Studies Honors:

To be eligible for INTS Honors, students must meet the following criteria:

- I. As an incoming freshmen, students will need to have at least a (V+M) 1250 (SAT taken prior to March 2016) or 1310 (SAT taken during or after March 2016) or 28 ACT, and rank in the top ten percent of their high school class (if applicable).
- II. As a transfer, students must have a 3.5 or higher GPA at their previous institutions, dual credit coursework is included.
- III. As a continuing TAMU student, students must have a minimum 3.5 GPR at Texas A&M.

Each new student enrolled into the INTS Honors Program will be assigned an INTS faculty member as a mentor according to his/her INTS track and interest.

Admissions are competitive and enrollment to the program will be limited to 20 new students every academic year. Students are encouraged to consult with INTS academic advisors as early as possible in their undergraduate career to plan their course sequences.

Students are ineligible to take honors courses if their cumulative GPA drops below a 3.5. Students would be able to resume honors coursework if their GPA returns to a cumulative 3.5.

### Departmental requirements to graduate with Honors in International Studies:

To be awarded International Studies Honors, students must attain a *minimum 3.5 cumulative GPR* and complete 18 hours of Honors coursework. The coursework is as follows:

- I. Six (6) hours of honors core curriculum courses either in Communication (KCOM), Literature, Language, Philosophy and Culture (KLPC), Creative Arts (KCRA), Social and Behavioral Sciences (KSOC), or Political Science (KPLL or KPLF)<sup>1</sup>
- II. Six (6) hours on any upper-division honors courses in ARAB, CHIN, FREN, GERM, INTS, ITAL, JAPN, RUSS, or SPAN
- III. Three (3) hours of INTS 201H: Introduction to International Studies, Honors Section<sup>2</sup>
- IV. Three (3) hours of INTS 497: Independent Honors Study, or INTS 481H: Senior Seminar in International Studies, Honors Section

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<sup>1</sup> Prospective Freshmen and Transfer students who have completed these requirements may be permitted to substitute an alternative core curriculum requirement on a case-by-case basis

<sup>2</sup> Continuing students who have completed INTS 201 prior to being admitted to the program may substitute this requirement with an additional upper-division honors in INTS or a foreign language
